

HOW DO WE GET INVOLVED

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO


- Sign up for Wear it Wild at givealittle.co.nz/event/wwf-wear-it-wild

- Spread the word to students and their parents, letting them know your Wear it Wild date and what they need to do to take part.
- Share your fundraising page to get donations rolling in.
- Download resources and activities to help you plan your roarsome day.

HUSH IT

Get everyone together for a roarsome film screening! There are plenty of wildlifeinspired family favourites to choose from – e.g. Happy Feet, The Lion King, and Finding Nemo.

MAKE IT

Take the DIY challenge and get students to create their own animal masks in the classroom.

STRUT IT

It's time to put your best fierce foot forward. Host a catwalk competition in the school hall and strut your stuff, for your world! Have the audience donate a gold coin in order to vote for their favourite runway look.

BUZZ IT

Hold a spelling bee with a prize for the number of wildlife-connected words they spell correctly.
